

## January Minute Bible Study

**Matthew 8:18-20** tells about the cost of being one of his disciples. What do you learn from these verses about following Jesus?

**Matthew 10:2 and Luke 6:12-15** name the twelve who we commonly refer to as “the apostles”. Read the list and notice the variety of people called to follow Jesus.

**Mark 2:18 – 22** contrasts Jesus with other disciples --- the disciples of John and the Pharisees. What was different about Jesus’ disciples? Why did they act as they did?

**Mark 8:33-35** has Jesus rebuking (or scolding) one of the disciples. Which disciple did Jesus rebuke and why?

Again in **Mark 20:13-16** Jesus disciples are in trouble. What does Jesus say a person must do to be his follower?

In **John 2: 1-11** we have a record of Jesus’ first miracle. How did this miracle affect his disciples? (vs. 11)

**John 8:31 -32** tells us what we must do to be a disciple. In the verses surrounding these two verses we learn what some of those things are. What do we gain when we are a disciple of Jesus?

After Jesus washed the twelve disciples’ feet he asked them a question. In **John 13:12-17** we have Jesus’ discussion with his disciples. What do we learn from this act that Jesus did?

**John 20:29 – 30** tells the reason for his writing of the Gospel that bears his name. What was the purpose and what did John hope for those who read what he had written?

**Acts 1:21 -26** tells of the replacement for Judas. What things were required of the one who replaced him?

**Acts 6: 1 -8** tells of the first fight in the Christian church. What was the role of the disciples in this conflict?

**Acts 11:19- 30** tells of the church in Antioch. What name was given to the disciples of Christ for the first time, according to verse 26?
